SAFETY Rx WITH DOC TRUESDALE

Spring has sprung, clocks have been turned forward, weather is getting warmer, rain is here, flowers are blooming, trees are budding. All this leads to more riding, however be aware of slick roads, pollen and allergies, vehicles not used to looking for us on the roads. Cool mornings, warm afternoon, and cool again in the evening.



If you have not ridden during the winter time, give your bike a good once over (TCLOCS) and be sure it is ready for your enjoyment. Once you have checked out your bike, take it for a short ride around the neighborhood to get your "riding refresher" completed and be ready for the All American H.O.G. rides on the calendar.

This also brings in the season called "construction", the upgrading of poor roads, bridges, and the building of new roads. Locally we can "ride around" the work area on some great back roads. When traveling we may not have that luxury, so be ready for anything while out riding.
