On each ride, you will perform the following:

1. Ensure you have a complete understanding of all the forms required to be filled out. Ensure all forms are completed and returned to the lead road captain for the event.
2. Attend and understand all aspects of the pre-ride briefing. This should include the route, stops, ultimate destination, riding practices and unique items associated with the specific ride.
3. Meet with the riders to determine skill levels and any personal issues relating to the ride. Such as, need to drop off at a specific location, new bike with limit on speed, new rider, and etc.
4. Listen and learn from the lead road captain. If you have a radio, listen to the ride dialog between the lead and rear road captains. Understand calls for lane changes, upcoming turns, road hazards, calling clear as all riders make a light or some are caught at a light.
